From the town Board of Finance East Haddam budget: Terms you should know

The East Haddam Board of Finance (BoF) is responsible for the oversight and submittal of the Annual Town Budget to the citizens. The Annual Town Budget includes the Board of Education Budget and the Town Government Budget. The preparation of the Annual Town Budget is the result of a process that starts with a tri-board meeting of the Board of Finance, Board of Education and Board of Selectmen. The process continues from the triboard meeting with a series of meetings, workshops and public hearings.

The conclusion of the process is the budget referendum. One of the areas where The BoF believes it can help the budget development process be more effective is by helping to make sure that the discussions in the meetings, workshops and public hearings are clear and understandable for the citizens in attendance. Consequently, the BoF has written a series of articles to be printed in the *East Haddam News*. The purpose of this series of articles is to explain the financial terms that are commonly used in the budget meetings. In this week's paper, we are starting the series with this article that explains the meaning of six financial terms. They are:

1. **Revenue**—Income from property taxes, local revenue (such as permit fees, license fees), specific town investment earnings, endowments, state and federal grants, etc.

2. **Expenditures**—Funds spent on services such as public safety and education, payroll, employee benefits, capital projects, etc.

Occupants escape after pickup crashes into Machimoodus pond

A report of a vehicle on its roof in a Machimoodus State Park pond Sunday, March 4, sent East Haddam police and fire departments and state DEEP Environmental Conservation (EnCon) Police to the Leesville Road scene, but investigation showed that both occupants had escaped safely.

The report came in at about 7:28 a.m. The park visitor who reported the incident was unsure at the time if the vehicle was still occupied.

As EnCon and local police tried to locate the driver using the 1987 Nissan pickup truck's license plate, fire personnel entered the water to verify that the truck was indeed unoccupied. Police found that the driver, Michael Dorsey, 24, of Neptune Avenue, was at home and uninjured.

According to a report from DEEP, Dorsey and his passenger, 25-year-old Keith O'Briant of Leesville Road, had traveled through Sunrise State Park to the Machimoodus State Park by driving to the left of the gate and guardrail. They said the throttle became stuck, and the truck ended up going into the pond by the parking lot.

EnCon Police issued Dorsey infractions for simple trespass and vandalism. O'Briant was issued an infraction for simple trespass. No injuries were reported as a result of the incident.



prepared them for the auditions and the festival.


Each year, the Connecticut Music Educators Association hosts auditions and music festivals in the four geographical regions of Connecticut. The eastern region — the biggest in Connecticut, with 68 school districts participating — auditioned hundreds of students in November. Those who achieved qualifying audition scores took part in the festival.

The two-day festival featured many performing groups, including a concert band, jazz band, orchestra and two choruses: treble choir and mixed choir. The three Hale–Ray students participated in both choruses.

After nine hours of rehearsal under the direction of Russell Hammond and Meredith Neumann, the 8member treble choir and 133-member mixed choir performed to a full house at Connecticut College. Their challenging programs included musical styles from as far away as the Brazilian rain forest to as close as beautiful American folk songs. Both choirs received standing ovations from the audience of more than 1,000. It was a memorable weekend and invaluable educational experience — one that Hale-Ray vocal students have participated in for the past 13 years.



3. Budget—A plan or schedule that adjust expenses during a certain time period to the estimated or fixed income for that period. A more detailed definition is also stated here — A budget is "a comprehensive plan, expressed in financial terms, by

which an operating program is effective for a given period of time. It includes estimates of: (a) the services, activities, and projects comprising the program; (b) the resultant expenditure requirements; and (c) the resources useable for their support." Source: Handbook for Connecticut Boards of Finance.

4. Grand List—The Grand List is the total amount of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Town. The Grand List is determined by assessing all of the taxable property in town (commercial, residential, utilities, etc.). The Grand List directly determines the amount of property tax revenue the town can collect. The revenue in the Annual Town Budget comes from many sources. However, "the property tax is the largest single source of local government revenue in the United States." Source: Handbook for Connecticut Boards of Finance. The rest of the revenue comes from fees, state and federal grants, town investments, earnings, etc.

5. Mill Rate—The Grand Levy is the amount of tax revenue in the Annual Town Budget, which must be raised by the property tax. For a given fiscal year

the mill rate is expressed in mills as a ratio of the needed revenue to the total amount of the Grand List. A mill is one one-thousandth (1/1000) of a dollar. The mill rate is determined first by approving what the needed property tax revenue is going to be for a given year, then dividing the needed revenue by the total amount of the Grand List. The mill rate is used to determine the tax bill for a given property by multiplying the assessed value of that property by the mill rate. For example, the tax bill for a property assessed at \$100,000 with a mill rate of 28.52 mills would be 28.52 multiplied by \$100,000 and then divided by 1000 equals \$2,852.00.

6. Revaluation—A periodic program undertaken by a municipality in order to appraise all real property in terms of its full and fair market value by bringing all properties to 100 percent of their true market value and by the same standards. A revaluation program seeks to spread the tax burden equitably within the municipality by ensuring that all property owners pay their fair share of taxes based on the actual true market value of the property they own.


