Golfers rate Fox Hopyard best course in Connecticut

Long known as an outstanding golf course, Fox Hopyard Golf Club recently was recognized as the best course in Connecticut in 2018-and number 24 in the nation-by Golf Advisor, a sister company of The Golf Channel.

Opened in 2001, the scenic 18hole course is set on 123 of the club's 519 acres—rolling, wooded and well-watered land. Length ranges from nearly 7,000 to 5,650 yards depending on the tee and par is 71.

The season's opening day at the semi-private course, where the public is welcome along with its members, was April 1, and Brian Cummings, the newly appointed Director of Golf Operations and Membership, said he is aiming for an even better 2019. "We feel this recognition by a survey of golfers themselves is the culmination of many practices that are in place here," he said. "Our goal is to provide the ultimate experience and the best conditions for our patrons. Our whole team here is very excited about having our efforts rewarded."

In other golf news, Fox Hopyard will host the prestigious Connecticut Amateur Golf Championship this year, from June 17-21. On the opening two days, 144 golfers will compete to qualify to be among the 32 finalists to reach the match play elimination rounds that will crown the 2019 champion. "This is the biggest tournament we have hosted," Cummings said, adding, "All efforts

Town meeting on school repairs called for April 16

A town meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 16 at 8 p.m. at the Town Meeting Hall (next to the Grange) to approve funding to rehabilitate the outside masonry and windows at the East Haddam Elementary School. The Board of Selectmen approved the call for town meeting during their regular April 3 meeting.

Town residents will vote whether to approve a transfer of \$21,725.31 from the town's General Fund to the Board of Education Capital Reserve Fund, and to amend the charge of the board's Capital Improvement Building Committee.

The selectmen also discussed the Request for Qualifications the town recently put out to find developers to transform the Village area's former town office property. Four prospective developers attended the site walk as well as an observer from the Goodspeed. First Selectman Emmett Lyman said the town was working with its attorneys to determine if there could Continued on page EH6

Turn in old unwanted meds on April 27

The East Haddam Police, the Resident Trooper, and the Drug Enforcement Administration is giving residents an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

People can bring pills for disposal to the East Haddam Senior Center on Great Hillwood Road on Saturday, April 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health shows year after year that the majority of misused and abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including someone else's medication being stolen from the home medicine cabinet.



Calls for changes at Transfer Station

Thank you for keeping us informed on the transfer station, although after reading your latest article I find the urge to write a viewpoint of what is happening and what could help alleviate the problem.

So, since August 2017 when the Town of East Haddam or rather its Board of Selectmen authorized a committee to study ways to improve the operation of the transfer station, all that has been accomplished is:

1.) Increasing the bulky waste fee from \$100 to \$120 a ton

2.) All vehicles are now weighed for bulky waste disposal

3.) Supposed to check for stickers

This has been a joke for nearly the 15 years I have lived in town. People are not "sneaking by the

I probably paid half the time I used the bulky waste area due to the weigh station being unmanned, followed other vehicles which did not stop to be weighed or was told by the attendant to go ahead it's not that much. So 689 tons of waste generated \$66,566 in 2013 (average collected \$97 a ton, almost the \$100/ton mark), who knows what 2014 and 2015 were, and 900 tons generated \$36,251 in 2016 (average collected \$40/ton). Wow, when \$90,000 should have been received and only \$36,000 got deposited, without naming names, after losing \$54,000 the person(s) responsible should be reprimanded or released for not operating the department properly. Surely they received the standard yearly wage increase no matter the performance. It's just the taxpayers money! What are the numbers for 2017 and 2018? How much have we lost in the last 5 years?

Years ago the town issued stickers with the tax bill. For a time transfer station employees were putting stickers on vehicles as they did mine when I acquired a new vehicle. Then no stickers were available when I last requested one as I was told changes were

Letter details town's various endowment funds

Like many towns in Connecticut, East Haddam has had many financial challenges over its long history. This year the Town is facing two high cost issues in addition to the day-to-day operation of town government and the education of our children. One issue is the removal of trees killed by the gypsy moth and emerald ash borer infestations. The second issue is the repair and reconstruction of roads, bridges and water drainage damaged by last fall's severe rainstorm.

However, when East Haddam has tough financial issues or concerns, we must remember that our town is very fortunate to have had citizens in its past who have, through their wills, left substantial funds dedicated to helping the town meet its needs in key areas. These funds are called endowments. East Haddam has probably more endowment funds than most towns of our size. Most of these endowment funds contribute to the revenue for East Haddam's operating budget each year or support Town endeavors. Please keep in mind that these endowment funds were primarily created to improve the quality of edu-

coming. And now there is a sticker though I don't
have one, didn't know about it and have not been
checked yet.

Let's stop pussyfooting around, get people to do their job or be sent down the road. The town should let everyone know (text, e-mail, newspaper) that a sticker is required and will be issued when you show proof of a "registered vehicle in East Haddam" or "property tax bill." Then hire a 'temporary' employee through an agency for 3 months to check and enforce vehicles entering the transfer station and issue stickers. Immediately let commercial haulers know that there is a fee to dump no matter what or rather it is not accepted from commercial haulers.

Do more now. Fix the problem and move on to the next one. Traveling in circles for years gets you nowhere.

This is one example of why the budget increases every year. It's time to change and not just this department. The greatest percentage of tax money is education and with falling enrollment numbers that budget needs to go down, not up.

cation and the quality of life in our Town. The citizen donors knew that money was needed to help maintain and improve these qualities. The table below is a short summary of the major endowment funds for East Haddam.

These funds cannot be spent without constraints. They are managed by administrators appointed by the Town or by the stipulations of the donor citizen's will. This means that the principal is left untouched unless allowed by the fund's administrator. The principal untouched indicates that only some percentage of the principal's value is expended each year to allow for principal stability and growth. A typical distribution is 4 percent of the average principal balance over the last four years. In summary, East Haddam is very fortunate to have such generous and forward thinking citizens in its history. Over the years these Endowment Funds have contributed millions of dollars to the town's yearly budgets, the operation of the public facilities, and the education of our students.



be a second site walk for interested parties who were unable to make it to the first. All qualifications must be submitted by May 16 at 2 p.m. The RFQ is available on the town's web site- www.easthaddam.org.

There was also discussion of the town's Cemetery Committee, which was brought up during a previous selectmen's meeting on March 20. The committee, which is comprised of two members, requested more responsibility and a clearer direction for its overall charge.

Unlike every town board and committee, the Cemetery Committee does not have a formal charge or operating budget, which has led to some oversights, like halted payments to the Hadlyme Congregational Church.

According to Town Clerk Debra Denette, the town paid the Hadlyme Congregational Church interest payments since the 1990s, however, those payments stopped and now the town owes the church \$2,343.80. "Where have those funds been for the last 10 years, and why isn't there any oversight for it...it's because you don't have a committee with a charge," said Denette during the April selectmen meeting. "The cemetery committee has a huge need for a charge, and I don't understand why we have one committee that has zero charge whatsoever. Every other board and committee is responsible for its budget and (the cemetery committee) doesn't even know what its budget is," said Denette. The town is also experiencing a shortage in cemetery space, and the selectmen believe the committee should begin investigating areas suitable for expansion, something that was identified in the town's 2008 Plan of Conservation and Development. The plan also acknowledged the need to evaluate the condition of the town-owned cemeteries and to determine how to ensure their longevity.

There are 23 cemeteries in the town, 10 of which are maintained by the town. Four are cared for by a local contractor because they require more care, and the other six are kept by part-time staff, said Ron Turner, the town's Director of Operations. The cemeteries are currently mowed regularly and crews are cutting down hazardous trees. The town also installed signs for the more prominent cemeteries, said Turner.

Drama portrays life of aide to actor William Gillette

A one-act play at the East Haddam Historical Society & Museum depicts the remarkable life of Yukitaka Osaki, who came to America in 1888 and stayed on to work alongside actor William Gillette at his famous Hadlyme castle. Osaki became a beloved member of the community and outlived Gillette by five years, dying in 1942 at the castle while his native country was at war with his adopted homeland.

The 45-minute show, suitable for ages 12 and over, is on Thursday, April 11 at 7:30 p.m. at the EHHS on Town Street. It is written and directed by East Haddam resident Kandie Carle and produced by the East Haddam Stage Company. Osaki is played by Taku Hirai. Born in 1865, Osaki visited America in his early 20s with his brother Yukio; the latter returned to Japan and became a leader in Japanese politics, while Yukitaka remained here, went to work for Gillette in 1900 and lived through two World Wars at the castle, even after Gillette passed away in 1937.

A 1942 obituary in The Day describes Osaki, 85, as "butler, secretary and general factotum" to Gillette. He was found dead by a caretaker; the cause was "due to infirmities of age," according to Dr. Julian S. Ely, who served as the area's doctor for decades.

The article continues: "Born in Japan, he was of a high class family and well educated. He held a position of trust with Mr. Gillette and became well known in the community, where he was highly regarded. He greatly deplored the war between his native land and the United States."

Land Trust signs contract for 87-acre Miller Farm

The East Haddam Land Trust (EHLT) has officially acquired the 87-acre Miller Farm property bordering Tater Hill and AP Gates Roads in eastern East Haddam. The price was \$340,000.

"This is the largest purchase of land EHLT has made in its forty year history", said EHLT President, Marilyn Gleeson. "We now protect almost 700 acres in this beautiful town for current and future generations."

EHLT identified the Miller Farm as a conservation priority for many reasons: its abundance of oak, beech, and tulip trees as well as spicebush, winterberry, and blueberry shrubs plus ferns, mosses, and wildflowers make it ideal habitat for woodland creatures. The property lies within East Haddam's section of Audubon Connecticut's Lyme Forest Block Important Bird Area, acreage critical to overwintering and migratory birds. The Miller Farm is in the Roaring Brook and Eightmile River Watersheds and is close to EHLT's Sheepskin Hollow Preserve and the Town of East Haddam's Lena Preserve.

The Land Trust relied on multiple sources to complete this purchase. Private grants and a \$170,000 State of Connecticut Open Space and Watershed grant covered a bit more than half the cost, with the remaining dollars coming from donations to the Miller Farm Capital Campaign and from EHLT's existing land acquisition funds.

"While we now have the deed for the Miller Farm property, our financial obligations are far from complete," said EHLT Treasurer, Doreen Jezek. "We need to replenish our land acquisition fund dollars to allow us to act on future land preservation opportunities."

This is why EHLT's board of directors will con-

tinue accepting donations to the Miller Farm Capital Campaign until July 1, 2019. Donations may be made at www.ehlt.org or by mail to East Haddam Land Trust, PO Box 122, East Haddam, CT 06423.

"Our members have been so supportive of EHLT's land conservation efforts, which allows the land trust to preserve natural and historic sites in our beautiful town," Gleeson said. "We hope this support continues."

The Land Trust looks forward to inviting the public to an official opening of the Miller Farm Preserve once volunteers complete the work of creating a parking area, marking the Preserve boundaries, and blazing and clearing trails. These work party dates will be posted at www.ehlt.org and on the East Haddam Land Trust Facebook page; volunteers are always welcome.

Massachusetts, was ranked number two in that state in the same survey. "Any time either of our properties are ranked on state and nationally recognized lists, I am extremely proud," said Tim Van Epps, CEO of the Sandri Companies, which owns and operates the courses. "It shows that our commitment to these two beautiful properties is paying large dividends."

With accolades in hand, Cummings has launched a drive to add to the 181 existing single and family memberships: through the end of April new members can sign up without paying either the initiation fee or first quarter dues (https://golfthefox.com/ fox-hopyard/membership-rates/membership). Members' privileges include booking advance tee times and not paying greens fees or for practice range use, as well as discounts at On The Rocks restaurant (www.otrrestaurant.com). Also new this year, Fox Hopyard members have reciprocal privileges at Crumpin-Fox Club.

No 18-hole golf course is complete without the all-important "19th hole," and On The Rocks offers both fine and casual dining as well an array of beverages with which to either celebrate a round, or drown one's sorrows. The restaurant is open year round for lunch and dinner, now seven days a week. Among upcoming special events is an Easter Brunch Buffet on Sunday, April 21 from 11 to 3 p.m.

Executive Chef and General Manager Nick Muce said the restaurant is featuring farm-to-table specials this summer with food sourced from within a 10-mile radius, as well as a spring prix fixe special that features a three course meal with a glass of wine or beer for \$25 per person, from Sunday through Thursdays.

Cummings pointed out some new course improvements, including a new fleet of plush Club Car Golf Carts with touch-screen scoring and a GPS system that provides distances from the ball to the pin, to the front of the green, and, perhaps most important, the yardage necessary to clear the water hazard.
